October 29, 2010: Burlingame to San Carlos

Ride Information:

- **Start Location: Burlingame Caltrain Station**
- **Start/End Location: San Carlos Caltrain Station**
- **Start/End Time: 10:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.**
- **Lunch: Sea Cloud Park, bring a picnic lunch**
- **Length: 18.5 miles round trip**
- **Terrain: Flat, along shoreline for most of ride**
- **Type: On street with light traffic (2.5 miles), Class I multi-use path, paved and gravel surface (16 miles)**
- **Type of bike: mountain, hybrid**

Description: Upon leaving the Burlingame Caltrain Station, we travel east on bike lanes along Howard Avenue, turn right on North Humboldt and left on Peninsula Avenue taking us over Highway 101 into San Mateo County's Coyote Point Park. Here we begin our Bay Trail ride on new trail made possible through a Bay Trail grant completed by San Mateo County Parks. Continuing south, we travel on new trail in the City of San Mateo including a new bicycle/pedestrian bridge funded by the Bay Trail program. Further south, we pass San Mateo Bay Marshes, an overlook also funded by our grant program. Entering Foster City, we ride under the San Mateo Bridge and continue along the paved shoreline path for several miles along the City's outer levee. Sea Cloud Park is a good place to stop for lunch. Crossing Belmont Slough into Redwood City over the Oracle bicycle/pedestrian bridge, we continue on paved and gravel shoreline trails around the Redwood Shores peninsula through business parks and residential neighborhoods. At the tip of the peninsula, observation platforms provide overlooks of the Don Edwards San Francisco Bay National Wildlife Refuge. Heading towards San Carlos along the edge of Steinberger Slough, we have views of Bair Island until the trail terminates at the San Carlos Airport. Cross Highway 101 on Holly Street and ride directly to the San Carlos Caltrain Station.
