## November 5, 2010: South San Francisco to Brisbane

### Ride Information:

- **Start/End Location:** South San Francisco Caltrain Station
- **Start/End Time:** 9:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.
- **Lunch:** Oyster Point Marina, bring a picnic lunch
- **Length:** 11.5 miles round trip
- **Terrain:** Flat, along shoreline for most of ride
- **Type:** On street with light traffic (3 miles), Class I multi-use path (8.5 miles)
- **Type of bike:** road, mountain, hybrid
- **Transit Links:** After ride, take Caltrain from Bayshore Station back to South San Francisco (\$2.50 one way, check [www.caltrain.com/fares](http://www.caltrain.com/fares) for more information)

**Description:** Upon leaving the South San Francisco Caltrain Station, we travel on East Grand Avenue and take a right on Gateway Blvd to South Airport Boulevard for approximately one mile. At Belle-Air Road we'll take a left and cross the bicycle/pedestrian bridge over Colma Creek which brings us to the Bay Trail. South San Francisco has completed their eight-mile section of the Bay Trail and we'll travel the entire length of it along the shoreline. We will experience trail built many years ago near San Bruno Point, travel on trail adjacent to Genentech's headquarters and cross the bicycle/pedestrian bridge built by the South San Francisco Scavengers in October 2009. We will pass through Oyster Point Marina and see the site of the future South San Francisco Ferry Terminal. Along Oyster Cove, the trail extends along the edge of a business park and next to the Caltrain railroad tracks. We will head north into Brisbane and travel around the marina peninsula; then follow the bike lanes along Sierra Point Parkway under Highway 101. Sierra Point Parkway continues along the edge of the Brisbane Lagoon leading us into an industrial area. Taking a left on Lagoon Way and a right on Tunnel Avenue (streets without bike lanes), we will skirt the edge of a future development site on the Brisbane landfill where the Bay Trail will be built as a condition of approval. From the Bayshore Caltrain Station, we will catch a train back to our starting location at the South San Francisco Caltrain Station.
